All supplies are furnished for at least one mosaic: lots of glass, adhesives, grout, mortar, wood base, various other materials! A variety of tools are available for your use.

Here is a list of items for you to bring:

- Required safety glasses or your own eyeglasses/reading glasses will do
- Work shirt or apron to protect clothing during grouting
- Vinyl or Playtex-type gloves for grouting (NOT lightweight disposable gloves)
- Soft rags to clean grout old flannel or cotton t-shirts are best
- Box and/or bubble wrap to take your mosaic home

- Bring any optional small objects to include in a mosaic: shells, coins, beads, pebbles, buttons, etc.

- Dental pick, hobby tweezers, old toothbrush are useful.
- You may bring small wooden boxes, picture frames, etc. to mosaic after completing your first project.
- Journal or sketchbook.
