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Supply List

Sketch books made with paper that can handle pencil as well as ink and watercolor! • Bring at least TWO: one or more larger ones (9x12 or larger) in which to practice the skills taught and experiment with various media, and the other smaller one (5.5x8.5 or square) will be your keepsake for the week.

Drawing pencils

- Graphite pencils: 2H, HB, 2B, 4B, 6B (or a set of 6 or 12)

Erasers

- A pink pearl and a kneaded eraser

Colored pencils

- Your color selection should include southwest colors for the landscape (yellows, oranges, browns, earthy reds, and some grays), blues (sky), greens (plants), plus any other colors you think would be useful.

Watercolor pencils

- similar colors as suggested above.

Ink pens

- Brown and Black, medium point. Microns are good, or something like that.

Color pens or markers

- These can be felt tip, brush tip, fine tip, fat markers, whatever you want to use. Again, choose colors that will be useful in the desert environment. A larger opaque white marker can be handy.

Small watercolor travel set

- I have a Cotman Compact set of 14 half pans. There are also Pocket Sets of 12 or 8 that work well too. The idea is for it to be small and easy to carry when traveling and hiking.

Water brush

- These are brushes that have hollow handles that fill with water like a fountain pen. One or two are enough and great for travel!

Watercolor brushes

- Various sizes.

Water bottle of some type

- For you to drink from AND to fill a ..

Small water container

- For you to dip brushes in if you are not using a water brush.

Other Useful Equipment

Hat

Bag or Day pack to carry supplies if you want to hike and add to your sketchbook. Camp stool or a pad or something to sit on if you want to hike and can't find a rock to sit on and don't want to sit on the ground.
