Participants should bring along two drawings (not too detailed) around 6" x 8". We will transfer your final choice for the initial woodblock.

Please plan to bring:

- Carving Tool- X-Acto knife and multiple blades #11 (small box)
- * if you are skilled with woodcarving tools you may bring them along in addition to the X-Acto knife.
- Paint: palette of water colors. (think of color choices that work for you and the location)
- Mixing palette you can find some white plastic containers at discount stores like Ocean State . they also have boxes of water color paints that will work as well.
- Brushes: Minimum of 3 watercolor Brushes #6 #8 #10
- Small Sponge;
- Printing tools: I use a Silver soup spoon for most of my pieces. you can be creative with a small barren, smooth wooden drawer pulls can work as well.
- Push Pins (small box)
