Hello artists!

Welcome to gorgeous Ghost Ranch and the *Cyanotypes: Creativity with the Sun* workshop. I'm looking forward to meeting with you and sharing creativity for our cyanotype weekend. Cyanotypes are one of the earliest forms of photography, and they offer an opportunity for a unique creative dance with nature, perfectly suited for our time at Ghost Ranch.

Cyanotypes can become a way of marking time and place. We will walk the box canyon trail to take photographs, make sketches and collect natural materials to use in our cyanotypes. Using these materials we will create our cyanotypes on paper or fabric. Time can be measured by the length of sun exposure, and even slight adjustments within that time frame, the time of day, or a daily repetition of prints. We will essentially be making an imprint of the impression that the natural environment of Northern New Mexico makes on you.

Cyanotypes offer an opportunity to let go of control and be surprised by the variations and effects that are achieved with natural exposure to sunlight. Think of this medium as a form of collage. We will be working with contact



prints of physical objects as well as hand-drawn transparencies. No two prints will turn out alike, even using the same materials and negatives.

On Friday night, we will meet after dinner to explore the world of cyanotype art, prepare our paper and fabric with emulsion, and begin to brainstorm ideas and compositions. Saturday we will walk the canyon and gather inspiration and materials, then return to our studio to expose our creations to the sun. After the cyanotypes dry we will have the opportunity to work back into them with various media, collage, and even sewing. Sunday we will create a few more prints, as well as continue with our finishing work, and have our own final art exhibition and discussion.

Most of the cyanotype materials will be supplied for you. But be sure to bring something to take photos with, a sketchbook/journal and any personal art media that you would enjoy using with the cyanotypes. You are also welcome to bring a piece of clothing and materials from home that have special meaning or interesting design. Of course, also pack hiking boots and clothing for being out in the weather. And bring your creative, playful, curious and intuitive self.

I look forward to a meaningful creative and place-based journey with you!

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Workshop Itinerary:

Friday

3:00 pm Check in begins

6:30 We will meet after dinner to explore the world of cyanotype art, prepare our paper and fabric with emulsion, and begin to brainstorm ideas and compositions.

Saturday

9-10:00 Meet in studio to check on substrates, go over plans and ideas

10-11:00 Walk the canyon and gather inspiration and materials

11-12:00 Return to our studio to organize our materials, and create drawings on transparency based on sketches or photos. We will do a demo/test cyanotype print and begin to design compositions. When ready, we will expose our creations to the sun, rinse them to stop the chemical process, and arrange them to dry.

12-1:00 Lunch

1-3:00 Studio time to continue preparing compositions.

3-5:00 Free time to explore Ghost Ranch or to continue to work on the above (open studio).

Sunday

9-12:00 After the cyanotypes dry we will have the opportunity to work back into them with various media, collage, and even sewing. We will create a few more prints, as well as have our own final art exhibition and discussion.
