I will have all the supplies you need to create wonderful pieces. I've listed the materials below, but I'll also bring various embroidery flosses and threads and other materials if you want to wait and purchase them on site.

Required Materials:

Scissors: I recommend small embroidery scissors and a pair of larger scissors.

Sashiko Threads: if you have them. You can find them on various websites such as Etsy and Amazon, but I will bring some along as well if you'd like to wait until the workshop.

Sashiko Needles: You can also find them on Etsy or Amazon, and I will bring extra along as well.

Fabric Squares: can be cotton and/or linen. You can bring a handful of these in sizes 5x5 and 13x27. The 5x5 will be used for small patches, and the larger ones will be used for towels. White, off-white, and navy are great, but you can bring other colors as long as they are one solid color.

Ruler: At least 12 inches

Fabric marking pen: needs to be invisible/washable.
